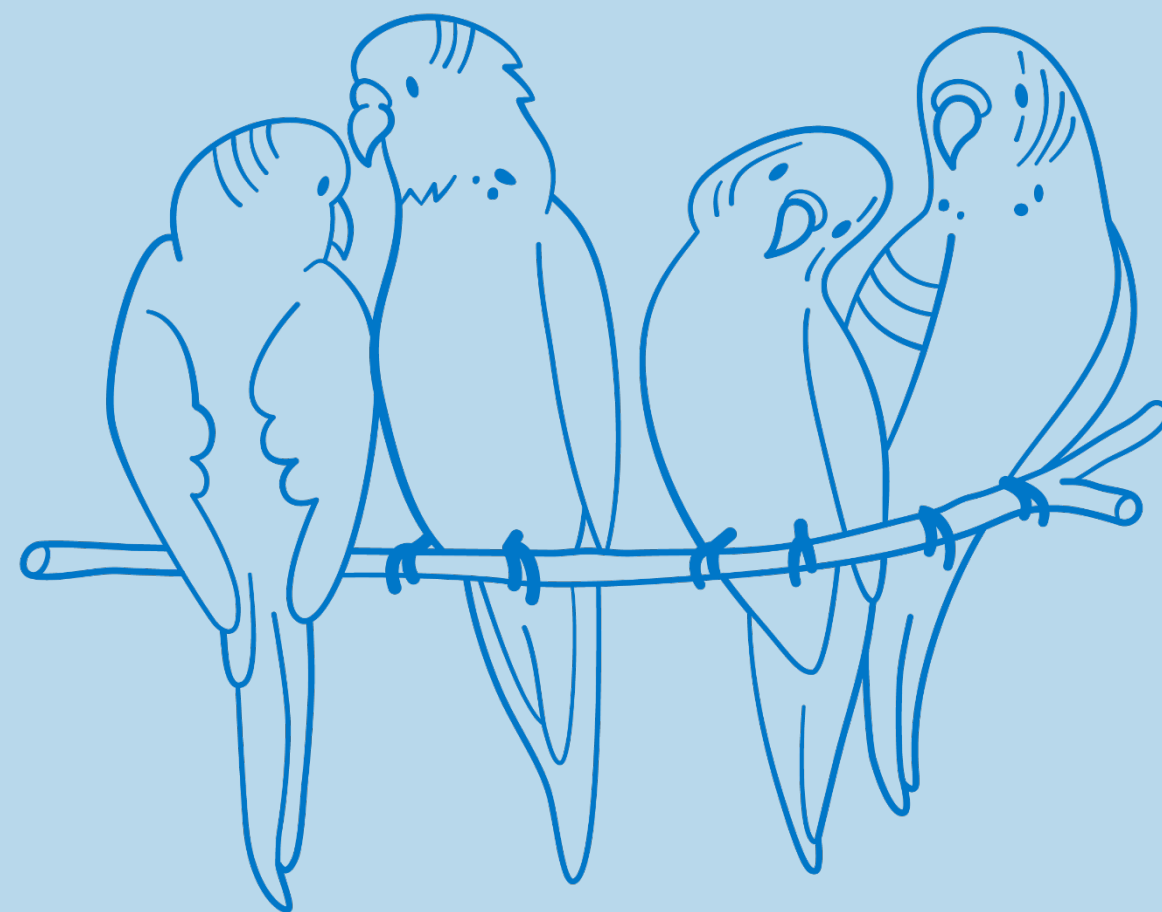

This presentation also makes reference to certain supplementary financial measures that are commonly used in the retail industry, including “System-wide sales”, “Same-store sales growth (decline)”, “Same-store transaction growth (decline)”, and “Same-store average spend per transaction growth (decline).” These non-IFRS measures, non-IFRS ratios and supplementary financial measures are used to provide investors with supplemental measures of Pet Valu’s operating performance and thus highlight trends in its core business that may not otherwise be apparent when relying solely on IFRS financial measures. The Company also believes that securities analysts, investors and other interested parties frequently use non-IFRS measures, non-IFRS ratios and these supplementary financial measures in the evaluation of issuers. Management uses non-IFRS measures and non-IFRS ratios in order to facilitate operating performance comparisons from period to period, to prepare annual operating budgets and to determine components of management compensation.
